This two-story 1865 landmark hosts Granville's main eatery. On Saturday nights, It also hosts the Sutton Ole Timir Music: Hour, a bluegrass dinner show similar to the Grand Ole Opry.

Granville Whiskey Decanter Museum

Nation's Largest Decanter Museum with over 5,000 decanters featuring Jim Beam and Ski Country. The Museum expansion opens May 6, 2023.

Granville Museum

Housed in a historic church building, this museum highlights the town's hentage. Steamboat Days in Granville will be featured in the Exhibition Center.

Granville Tour

Take a guided or self-guided tour of the town, starting at the Sutton homeplace and Pioneer Village. Stroit through eight museums showcasing antique cars, ice cream and more. Also, visit the new Tennessee Quilt & Textile museum!

Sutton Homeplace & Pioneer Village

The 19th-century residence has been restored with authentic furnishings, but with themed exhibits that change every.

Mayberry - I Love Lucy Museum

Check out Lucy's house, right down to the vintage dishes in her kitchen, then strail through Floyd's barbershop and the rest of Andy's neighborhood.

Farm to Table Museum

This museum traces what's grown on the farm to your plate, along with how animals were once part of the area's transportation system.

Shopping, Bed & Breakfasts, and Waterfront Fun

Shop for gits, clothing, Mayberry & Lucy, items, and stay for a couple nights at one of our two B&Bs in the center of town. Experience Wildwood Marina for waterfront fun and food.

Festivals Galore


Seven annual festivals throughout the year celebrate everything from Mayberry to moonshine.


In Sparta, Kayaking Adventures of Tennessee offers guided kayaking trips to Burgess Falls on a peaceful lake for all skill levels.

No vacation is complete without photos, and the Upper Cumberland has some incredible selfie spots. Near Sparta, snap a selfie in front of Burgess Falls, a cascading waterfall that plunges more than 130 feet into a limestone gorge at Burgess Falls State Park and Natural Area. Also near Sparta, Welch's Point can be found at the end of a quick 0.3-mile walk and rewards visitors with a stunning view of the Tennessee hills over the Caney Fork River. Welch's Point is located within the Virgin Falls State Natural Area. Near Monterey, take a short hike on the 0.7-mile trail that leads to the Bee Rock Overlook, a beautiful photo spot with panoramic views.

Foodie Finds

Hungry? You won't run out of delicious places to eat in the Upper Cumberland.

In Gainesboro, The Bull & Thistle Pub serves fine Celtic fare on the historic courthouse square. Favorites include fish and chips, Irish meatloaf and corned beef and cabbage. Seafood lovers shouldn't miss The Stolen Coin Oyster Bar & Bistro, a hidden gem on Main Street in Gainesboro.

For breakfast or lunch, Haven on Hull in Gainesboro has an enticing array of handmade sandwiches, salads, baked goods, coffees and teas.



Coffee & Doughnuts

Coffee fans make a beeline to Button Willow General Store & Coffee Shop in Smithville for its flavored coffees (both hot and iced) and merchandise by local artists. For a sweet treat, head to Ralph's Donut Shop in the heart of Cookeville for doughnuts, of course, cinnamon rolls, cream horns, muffins, lady fingers, turnovers and more.



Savor the Breweries & Wine Trail

When happy hour rolls around, check out what's on tap at Happy Trails Brewing Co. in downtown Sparta. The small brewery and taproom serves a mix of their own beers along with other local, regional and national beers. While in Sparta, you can also visit Calfkiller Brewing Co., a brewery started by two brothers. Reserve a behind-the-scenes tour and see how the beer is made. Wine lovers will enjoy exploring the Upper Cumberland Wine Trail, which includes eight family-owned wineries and vineyards. Many offer free tastings, and travelers who complete the entire wine trail receive a special gift after receiving the final stamp on the Wine Trail Rack Card.





Venture Underground

Choose your own underground adventure, from easy to extreme, at Cumberland Caverns near McMinnville. Located in Cardwell Mountain, Cumberland Caverns invites you to journey 333 feet beneath the surface and discover its storied history and rare formations.

Take a Trip Back in Time

Visit Granville, Tennessee's Mayberry Town. The nostalgic town is operated by 200 volunteers who serve as docents in its historic buildings and museums. Tour the T.B. Sutton General Store, the Mayberry and I Love Lucy Museum, an 1800s cabin, Pioneer Village and more.

Every Saturday night, the Sutton General Store hosts the Sutton Ole Time Music Hour, a live bluegrass radio



show complete with a Southern style dinner. Book an overnight stay at Wildwood Resort & Marina on the shores of Cordell Hull Lake. The resort has a lodge and cabin rentals, vintage Airstream trailer rentals, restaurants, pontoon boat excursions and live music.



Shopping & History on the Square

The town of Livingston dates to 1833, and the center of activity for the community has always been the Livingston Town Square. Residents take pride in preserving the square's history and viability, and visitors can spend a day shopping among the square's historic buildings housing a variety of merchants. You'll find antiques, boutiques, jewelers, and the 1806 General Store, which has a popular eatery that serves homemade soups, salads and daily specials.



akes and rivers are healing and great for our mental health. Studies have shown that just being around the water provides us with a sense of calm. The beauty that nature gives us truly does make us happier.

The lakes and rivers of the Upper Cumberland offer plenty of "happy." There are abundant opportunities for fishing, camping, picnicking, boating, canoeing, hiking, and recreation for the whole family. Or if you just want to sit by the water and soak in the calm, we're sure we can arrange that too.





The three major lakes in the UC are Center Hill Lake, Cordell Hull Lake and Dale Hollow Lake. All are under the stewardship of the U.S Corps of Engineers and have been named the cleanest lakes in the state.

The three lakes were originally created by dams built for hydroelectric power generation and flood control. Each of the lakes offers an amazing number of recreational activities, and our temperate climate makes the lakes accessible for most of the year.

So come splash around in the lakes of Upper Cumberland. There are adventures waiting for you here!

Center Hill Lake



Center Hill Lake is a 64-mile long reservoir with 415 miles of largely undeveloped shoreline and 18,200 acres of deep, pure water – the ideal habitat for many species of fish. In addition, there is an abundant supply of wildlife that adds to the natural beauty of DeKalb County and gives sportsmen a diversity of game during the hunting seasons.

Water sports enthusiasts enjoy fishing, swimming, boating and kayaking on the lake. The Army Corps recreation areas offer camping and RV spaces at their parks around the lake.

Nine marinas offer houseboat or pontoon boat rental and they also offer slips for private boats. There are also 7 marina restaurants on and off the lake.





Cordell Hull Lake



Cordell Hull Lake is located at the base of the Highland Rim, right on the Cumberland River in Smith, Jackson, and Clay counties of middle Tennessee. Outdoor recreation activities abound at Cordell Hull and include camping, boating, picnicking, hiking trails, bike trails, horse trails, and wildlife viewing.

If you love fishing, this lake is like a fish convention, with largemouth bass, small-mouth bass, spotted bass, channel catfish, flathead catfish, black crappie, white crappie, walleye, bluegill, sunfish, rock bass, warmouth, white bass, yellow bass, striped bass, hybrid striped bass, paddlefish and sauger.

Cordell Hull Lake has two marinas. One is at Defeated Creek and the other at the Wildwood Resort & Marina near Granville.

Dale Hollow Lake



In 1943 the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers built the first dam on the Obey, creating the huge Dale Hollow Reservoir. Dale Hollow Dam tamed a wild river and drew tourists and fishermen to the vacation and recreation.

The lake boasts 12 marinas that offer everything for water adventure and outdoor fun. You can rent houseboats or pontoon boats or bring your own and launch it from the many sites. Around the lake there are lots of cabins for rent, plus camp and RV sites. The Corps of Engineers has several parks around the lake for family fun. Plus it is ideal for fishing.









day on the river is as relaxing or as thrilling an adventure as you want to make it. It's a place to make memories with family, friends and fellow travelers, to escape the trials of the daily grind and lend you a fresh perspective on life.

If you want to venture off the beaten path and to connect with nature, the beautiful rivers of the Upper Cumberland hold something for everyone, from gentle paddles through lush countryside to whitewater kayaking for all skill levels.

If you are an angler, the broad slow rivers and peaceful lakes yield an abundance of fish, from bass to trout, bluegill to catfish, and some of the best sauger fishing you are likely to find in Tennessee.

Cumberland River




The Cumberland River was an important river highway in the 1700's, and supported a large riverboat trade. The river is popular among water enthusiasts, and there are a number of parks, boat ramps and facilities along the way, making a day or overnight paddle appealing.

Obey River



The Obey River is a favorite canoeing, kayaking and fishing destination. The campground beside the Obey, managed by the US Army Corps of Engineers, has just about anything a camper could want. It is located right by the Dale Hollow National fish hatchery. To the delight of fishermen, the hatchery is one of the main reasons the Obey contains large numbers of rainbow and brown trout.





Caney Fork River



A bald eagle silently soars above, hunting for breakfast. Fish ripple the water in search of tasty insects. The water is placid and glassy, ideal for a morning paddle, but it can move surprisingly fast when Center Hill Dam releases water. This is the Caney Fork, known for its beauty and peaceful demeanor, and a

favorite for canoe and kayak enthusiasts and anglers alike. In Rock Island State Park, the Caney Fork is also known for whitewater kayaking, and the State Park has hosted a number of international freestyle kayaking events.

Collins River




Designated as a "Scenic River," the Collins River is a tributary of the Caney Fork, and flows about 60 miles through the Cumberland Plateau. The overhanging woods hug the banks as the river leisurely makes it way westward, which makes for a relaxing and peaceful paddle. Renowned for its fishing, the Collins River is one of the few rivers in Tennessee stocked with Muskie.

Barren Fork River



The Barren Fork is a 23.4 mile-long tributary of the Collins River, and flows east to west, eventually through the town of McMinnville. It is ideal if you are looking for a smooth, steady current that is perfect for a lazy float in a kayak or canoe. Two easy access points for the river are Riverfront Park right below the dam and Smooth Rapids Outfitters.















ooking for amazing vistas? You've come to the right place. Tennessee's Upper Cumberland is resplendent with beautiful wooded valleys and gorgeous views. The green is deep and up here on the Cumberland Plateau, the water is clean and the mountains are fetching! The rugged landscape also gives rise to bluffs and cliffs, many of them easily accessible.

Bee Rock Overlook

Putnam County, I-40 Exit 300 and follow the signs.



Tucked away near Monterey, a short 0.7 mile hike will bring you to Bee Rock, where you will be treated to views of miles and miles of beautiful hills, woods and valleys.

Black Mountain Trail/Overlook

Cumberland County, 2000-3398 Black Mountain Rd, I-40, Exit 329



This south-facing overlook has views of two giant sinkholes including Grassy Cove, North America's largest sinkhole by volume.

Buzzard's Roost

Van Buren County, Fall Creek Falls State Park



There are several overlooks at Fall Creek Falls. Buzzard's Roost is one of the best. With easy access, Buzzard's Roost has views of Pine Creek on the left and Cane Creek on the right, plus plenty of hiking and waterfalls close by. Recently the iconic tree that graced the Roost fell victim to an ice storm.



Martha's Pretty Point

White County, Virgin Falls State Natural Area



Hike about 2 miles along the trail to Virgin Falls and you will find this overlook, which earned its name with a gorgeous view of Big Laurel Creek Valley and the Caney Fork River Valley.

Sunset Rock



White County, 6 miles east of Sparta on Hwy 70

It is not hard to understand why this overlook is called Sunset Rock. Sunset Rock can be accessed with a simple turn-off on old Hwy 70, and much to the delight of both local residents and tourists, the sky puts on

a different show every evening.



Welch's Point

White County, Bridgestone / Firestone Centennial Wilderness Area


Welch's Point in White County is easy to access. To get there, pass the Virgin Falls parking lot and take the fork to the right. Travel about two miles. When you park, you will have to walk less than 1,000 feet downhill. The overlook faces west for amazing sunsets and breathtaking views of Scott's Gulf and the Caney Fork River Valley.

The WATERFALLS Are Calling You

In the Upper Cumberland, you'll find roadside waterfalls, easy hiking destinations, hidden gems, spots tucked away on private land, backpacking opportunities with numerous waterfalls on one trip, and even kayaking adventures.

emphis has Graceland, Nashville is filled with honky-tonks & tunes, and the Smokies are certainly enchanting, but the Upper Cumberland is "The Land of Waterfalls," and you don't want to miss experiencing the area firsthand in 2023.

Within Upper Cumberland's 14 counties there are hundreds of waterfalls and cascades to explore. Out of the top 3 highest waterfalls in the state, 2 of them, Fall Creek Falls & Coon Creek Falls, are located in the region. If you've ever stood beneath a majestic waterfall that stands 250ft above you, then you know that it's a memory that you'll never forget. If you have not taken in the awe and wonder in such a scenario, now's your chance.

Looking at a list of all of the destinations that our beautiful area has to offer can be overwhelming but with a little guidance, you'll be on your way to chasing some of the most unforgettable waterfalls in America.







Play in a Park


If you're just beginning your journey of seeking out waterfalls in the Upper Cumberland, keep it simple and start with visiting our state parks. Rock Island State Park, Falls Creek Falls, Burgess Falls, Cummins Falls, and other state parks in the region are all great locations to discover some of our most stunning waterfalls while also enjoying all that the parks have to offer.

Guided hikes, family friendly programs and education experiences, camping and cabins, live music, and much more are offered but vary for each park. You can't go wrong with time in our state parks regardless of whether it is your 1st or 100th visit, but they're perfect first step to never-ending adventures.

Explore A Bit Off-The-Beaten-Path

State Natural Areas are maintained by the state park system but offer more of a wilderness experience. The focus for these public lands is to provide recreational opportunities for locals and guests but it's also centered more towards the preservation of the natural land and thus have less development than the state parks do.

Ozone Falls, Lost Creek Falls, Virgin Falls and Colditz Cove are included in this group of waterfalls and trails. While you won't find bathrooms with plumbing, snack machines, or the consistent presence of park staff, you will find some of the most pristine and tranquil areas in the state. With a little prepping ahead of time you can help to keep the natural beauty of each destination maintained by practicing responsible stewardship.



Experience Unique Waterfalls

ayak to the base of Burgess or Fancher Falls, take a summertime dip under Carmac Falls while a being a day or overnight guest at Evins Mill, get lost in curiosity as you watch the breathtaking flow of Virgin Falls disappear the moment it hits the ground, view two of the top three highest waterfalls in Tennessee drop 250ft to the ground at the same time, or study the geological wonders of the world while standing behind Big Laurel Falls.

The best time to visit our waterfalls? Late winter to early spring. Summer brings more of a crowd and evening storms can create a bit too much of a flow, but it is still a great time to be here as well.

From July to September is when some of the falls will start to trickle but thanks to having hundreds of waterfalls in the area, it's always possible to find plenty with flow too, it'll just take a little extra seeking. One example is Twin

Falls in Rock Island State Park. Twin Falls is a man-made waterfall that was created by accident when the dam was put in and pushed water out and into Caney Fork River, so it has a phenomenal flow at all times. There are best times to see this and that, but you can find beauty on any day that you spend here.

Are you ready to chase some waterfalls? Start planning your 2023 adventures today! Make your bucket list of waterfalls to visit on your trip. Find lodging in one of our state parks, a highly reviewed airbnb in the area, at any of our top rated resorts, or prep for a backpacking trip beneath the stars. While you're in town don't forget to leave time open to visit local shops, catch a live musical performance, sip a craft beer, some wine or a little shine, check out a museum, connect with local artists, check out a festival, grab some yummy grub, and take in the spirit of the Upper Cumberland.



WATERFALLS

There are 195 "described" waterfalls in Tennessee's Upper Cumberland, giving the region the distinction of having one of the highest concentration of waterfalls in the United States. Here's a few of the most popular waterfalls:



Burgess Falls

tnstateparks.com/parks/burgess-falls

Located on the Falling Water River, this day use park is noted for its natural beauty and four waterfalls that cascade down from over 250 feet in elevation. The last of these falls plunges more than 130 feet into the gorge.



Carmac Falls

evinsmill.com

Located on the private property of Evins Mill, a resort and special events venue, the short hike to the falls is reserved for guests, or you can purchase a reservations-only package.



Cummins Falls

tnstateparks.com/parks/cummins-falls

A 211-acre state park located in Jackson County. Its namesake, Cummins Falls, is a 75-foot waterfall on the Blackburn Fork.



Fall Creek Falls

tnstateparks.com/parks/fall-creek-falls

Tennessee's largest and most visited state park, Fall Creek Falls State park is home to numerous waterfalls, including Fall Creek Falls (one of the highest waterfalls in the eastern United States). Other waterfalls within the park include Piney Falls, Cane Creek Falls, and Cane Creek Cascades.



Northrup Falls

An easy trail in Colditz Cove State Natural Area passes towering rock walls and leading to a seventy-foot waterfall that plunges into a turquoise pool.



Lost Creek Falls

southeastwaterfalls.com/trail/lost-creek-falls/

Located in a natural area south of Sparta, the creek emerges from a large spring, dropping 40+ feet and disappearing underground. On the opposite side of this large sink is the entrance to Lost Creek Cave.



Ozone Falls

tnvacation.com/local/crossville-ozone-falls

The falls plunges 110 feet over a sandstone cap rock into a deep, rock-strewn pool. Located in Cumberland County, Ozone Falls is in one of Tennessee's most popular natural areas.



Twin Falls & Great Falls

tnstateparks.com/parks/rock-island

Located within Rock Island State Park, Twin Falls is 80 feet tall. Great Falls is located below the 19th-Century Cotton Mill, which the Falls powered over a 100 years ago.

Formed by an underground stream that emerges from a cave, the water drops over a 110-foot high cliff before disappearing into another cave at the bottom of the sink. Virgin Falls is at the end of a challenging 8.7 miles out-and-back hike.

BRYAN SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA


